

## KING MIDDLE SCHOOL-PARENT COMPACT

#### **School Responsibilities**

**King Middle school will:**

*Parents may become a part of the school volunteer program by filling out a volunteer application. Approved volunteers may schedule activities through PTO, club sponsors, or individual classroom teachers.*

**Parent Responsibilities**

- *Volunteering in my child's classroom.*

- *Staying informed about my child's education and communicating with the school by promptly reading all notices from the school or the school district either received by my child or by mail and responding, as appropriate.*
- *Serving, to the extent possible, on policy advisory groups, such as being the Title I, Part A parent representative on the school's School Improvement Team, the Title I Parent Advisory Committee, the District-wide Policy Advisory Council, the State's Committee of Practitioners, the School Support Team, or other school advisory or policy groups.*

**Student Responsibilities**

We, as students, will share the responsibility to improve our academic achievement and achieve the state's high standards. Specifically, we will:

- *Come to school every day (unless in poor health).*
- *Be on time and be ready to learn.*
- *Always do my best.*
- *Show respect to others, myself, my parents, and school staff.*
- *Seek peaceful ways to settle disagreements.*
- *Work cooperatively with others.*
- *Obey school and bus rules at all times.*
- *Do my homework every day and ask for help when I need to.*
- *Read at least 30 minutes every day outside of school time.*
- *Give my parents or adults responsible for my welfare all notices and information received from my school every day.*

**Additional Required School Responsibilities (requirements that schools must follow, but optional as to being included in the school-parent compact)**

**King Middle School will:**

1. Involve parents in the planning, reviewing, and improving the school's parental involvement policy in an organized, ongoing, and timely way.
