

School grades for middle schools in the state of Florida has 9 categories. Each category is worth 100 points, therefore our grade is based on the number of points we earn out of 900. The categories are as follows;

English Language Arts (FSA & FSAA)

- Achievement of students who scored a 3, 4, or 5.
- Learning Gains. Percent of students who increased their score at least one level from previous year.
- Learning Gains of lowest 25%. Percent of students who increased their score at least one level who scored in the lowest 25% the previous year.

Mathematics (FSA, EOC, FSAA)

- Achievement of students who scored a 3, 4, or 5.
- Learning Gains. Percent of students who increased their score at least one level from previous year.
- Learning Gains of lowest 25%. Percent of students who increased their score at least one level who scored in the lowest 25% the previous year.

Science (NGSSS, EOC, FSAA)

- Achievement of 8th grade students who scored a 3, 4, or 5 on Science state test.

Social Studies (EOC)

- Achievement of 7th grade students who scored a 3, 4, or 5 on Civics EOC.

Acceleration Success

- Achievement of students who pass a high school EOC or who earns an industrial certification. The numerator is the number of students who passed plus the number of students who earned an industrial certification in the prior year. The denominator is the number of 7th graders who scored a 3, 4, or 5 in the previous year.

The next step is to add the percent of all nine categories and the scale is as follows;

- A = 62% of points or greater
- B = 54% to 61 of points
- C = 41% to 53% of points
- D = 32% to 40% of points
- F = 31% or points or less
