

As per the Santa Rosa District Electronic Communications Policy, “All official sites representing the district will be hosted on servers located within the network of the School Board of Santa Rosa County or on approved alternate host sites. Teacher/staff pages – including communication tools such as, but not limited to, blogs and message boards – will be considered official sites and must also be hosted on district servers, on-site at the school or on a site approved by the Director of Inservice and Instructional Technology or the District Technology Committee.” The following Websites serve as APPROVED ALTERNATIVES to the District Web servers on which teachers may maintain classroom/school-related websites, blogs, etc. The Web hosting sites listed have been determined to be in compliance with the Children’s Internet Protection Act (CIPA). The district will make every effort to ensure that sites approved for classroom-oriented web hosting meet CIPA requirements and maintain their compliance with those requirements. However, the district CANNOT support usage of these sites by teachers. Support requests should be directed to the Web Administrator of the hosting site. Requirements for using one of the following sites for a classroom or school-related web:

1. Ensure that all materials on each page (including any host site banners or advertisements) comply with district guidelines and regulations specified in the Santa Rosa District [Electronic Communications Policy and AUP Implementation Guidelines](#),
2. **Students are not permitted to log into the sites, below. If a parent/guardian has granted permission to the Santa Rosa School District to place a child’s name, individual student picture/video/webcam image, and/or creative work(s), then placing a child’s name, individual student picture/video/webcam image, and/or creative work(s) is permitted on the sites, below. If student accounts are desired, the vendor must be on the [Approved Online Services/Vendors list](#).**
3. Give the site address to the school Technology Contact, who will forward it to the District Web Administrator,
4. **If the host site places advertisements on your pages, post a “Hyperlink Disclaimer” in a prominent place on your site. See Sample Santa Rosa Non-District Website Disclaimer at <http://www.santarosa.k12.fl.us/main/disclaimer.htm>**
