

CHAPTER 5.00 – STUDENTS

POSTSECONDARY APPLIED TECHNOLOGY (VOCATIONAL) PROGRAMS

5.13*+

- I. Santa Rosa County School District provides postsecondary vocational programs to residents of the Santa Rosa County area in accordance with Florida Statutes and State Board of Education rules.
 - A. Students defined as hearing impaired, visually impaired, or learning disabled are identified through self-disclosure in the registration, counseling, or instructional processes. District and vocational rehabilitation counselors are available on the campus of Locklin Technical Center to provide counseling services, testing, and assessments.
 - B. Reasonable substitutions are available for the following:
 1. Admission requirements for Locklin Technical Center;
 2. Admission requirements for a program of study where failure to meet stated requirements does not constitute a fundamental alteration in the admission criteria;
 3. Graduation requirements where there is no fundamental alteration in the nature of the program.
 - C. Students are advised about eligibility criteria and substitution requirements as they receive information about registration, during registration and throughout the instructional process, or until the student initiates self-disclosure.
 - D. An adult or high school student with a documented disability who is completing a postsecondary adult vocational program, but has been unsuccessful obtaining the designated exit criteria on the posttest may have their requirement waived based on established District procedures.
 - E. Locklin Technical Center Vocational rehabilitation counselors and other appropriate counselors are available on the campus to provide counseling services.
 - F. Students who do not qualify for substitution requirements may appeal to
 1. Director, Applied Technology, Adult and Community Education

2. Superintendent, Santa Rosa County School District
 3. Santa Rosa County School Board.
- G. A student who attends Locklin Technical Center shall be classified as either a high school student or an adult student.
1. A high school student is a student who is age sixteen (16) or older and is concurrently enrolled in a regular high school and Locklin Technical Center for one (1) to six (6) hours daily.
 2. An adult student is a person who is sixteen (16) years or older and has withdrawn from a regular school program.
- II. The Superintendent or designee shall maintain records on students who apply for and who are permitted to enter postsecondary programs on the basis of Florida Statutes and State Board of Education rules. Data collected shall be in accordance with State Board of Education rules.
- III. Upon the recommendation of the Superintendent, the Board may approve plans and agreements with institutions of higher education for dual enrollment and/or early admissions programs.
